## INTRODUCING EDDIE...



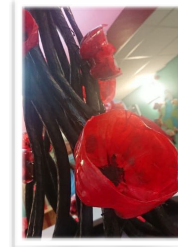

On [European Day of Language](#) we were going all over the world to [enrich the learning](#) - it was a fun day!

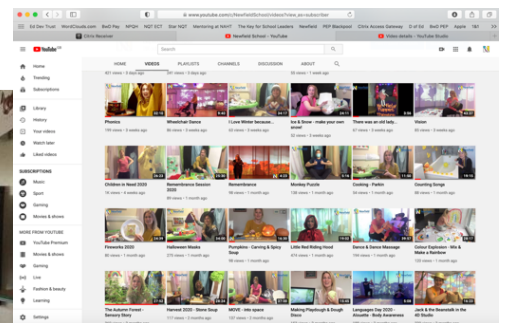
There have been many [curriculum activities](#) going on - have a look on the blog and you can see what the [children have been up to](#) in school.
