I Raised £200 for Abbey Village School and Newfield School toy library.


Thank you to everyone who sponsored me and to Mr. Barker and Andy Parkinson for

Debbie Riley, Outreach HLTA, has organised a buddy system in school partnering students from 14-19 phase with pupils from 2-13 phase. Class teachers from both phases were asked to suggest pupils from their groups who they felt would benefit from and enjoy being either a supportive buddy to a younger child or a supported buddy by an older student. Debbie has then paired pupils together. They meet on Wednesday lunchtimes from 1 o'clock until 1.30pm. The first session involved visiting each others classrooms. In following sessions so far they have read stories, played games and made things together. The supportive buddies know they have to chat to their buddies whenever they see them to build a rapport and to develop recognition and interaction. You can see the buddies together in the photos to the left. Eventually, the pairs will be able to work together in class whenever time allows. So far this has been really good fun and there are lots of people who are now asking to join the buddy system. Thanks very much Debbie for organising this for us.
