move on to new, exciting places and things. This has been an action packed year even by our standards - thank you all for your support whatever contribution you make it all helps us to be a very happy Newfield family.



SITTING VOLLEYBALL

BOCCIA

Monday started the week off with everyone in the school taking part in Boccia sessions, where they split into two teams and competed against each other to see who would win. The game of Boccia can be played by rolling or throwing the ball at different speeds, heights and angles to get the closest to the white target ball. As well as the physical skills learnt, they developed team skills, taking turns, co-ordination, competition and enjoyment.



CURLING



The game of 'Curling' was introduced to the children and staff on Wednesday. They had several lanes set up in the hall and had to aim the curling disc towards a target. Whereas the other games have involved balls and rolling/ throwing, todays sports involved pushing. The children had to determine and judge how hard or soft to push the disc in order to get closest to different targets.



On Tuesday the children explored the game of Sitting Volleyball. They took part as a team and practiced the skills needed to play the game and counted how many volleys they could get.





RACES

On Thursday the children and staff explored and played the game of

GOAL BALL

'Goalball'. Goalball is a game that has been

created for children with a visual impairment or

blindness. It has very simple rules, but the aim of the game is to get the ball in the opposite net. The children split off into 2 groups, then using ramps or the skill of rolling, got the ball into the opposite net to score a goal. The bell ball gave a lovely sensory approach to the sport and it was lovely to see everyone getting involved.

On the fifth and final day of National Sports Week, the children took part in different races against other classes. They joined up and completed running races, hurdles, relay, ball and spoon race, bean bag race and many more. As much as everyone wanted to win it was the fun of the races that everyone enjoyed the most and gave a lovely ending to a sporty week.





An orienteering activity was available to try all week, where the children could search and find different characters around school and learn different information about them.

All children received a 'National Schools Sports Week' certificate for taking part in the event and trying new Paralympic activities!





SHAKESPEARE DAY

The first day of Arts Week, we commemorated the 400th anniversary of the death of Shakespeare with a range of activities including pupils seeing artefacts and imported food, drink & recipes from the Elizabethan/Jacobean period. They also engaged in drama in the multi-sensory 4D studio, where they explored the witches of Macbeth and the enchanted forest of Midsummer Night's Dream. In the afternoon, each Key Stage was given a Shakespeare play to explore and performed a piece to the rest of the school. It was a lovely day with both staff and pupils enjoying and taking part in a prominent part of British history and culture.

Everyone had lots of fun and made lots of mess!


INSCAPE @ THE LOWRY





















After the meal, presentations took place – the hoodies looked great – and then we watched the leavers' video - and there were the usual laughs and tears along the way.














